Dear Senator Sullivan:

On behalf of the undersigned American maritime labor organizations, we are pleased to endorse your candidacy for reelection to the United States Senate. Together, our unions represent licensed and unlicensed American merchant mariners working aboard United States-flag commercial vessels operating in our nation's foreign and domestic shipping trades. We also represent other maritime personnel, including those mariners working aboard public and private ferry and other passenger vessel operations, and aboard civilian crewed ships in the government fleet; state licensed maritime pilots; and maritime industry shore side clerical and service employees.

We are pleased to endorse your reelection because of your strong, consistent support for America's maritime industry and your vigorous and persistent efforts in behalf of America's maritime workforce.

Your work in Congress to achieve a fully funded Maritime Security Program; to ensure full enforcement of America's U.S.-flag cargo preference shipping requirements; and to preserve our nation's coastwise shipping laws have helped ensure that our nation has the U.S.-flag commercial sealift readiness capability and the American mariners needed by the Department of Defense to support American troops and America's interests overseas.
